A Journey of “Remove and Replace”

Looking back at the decade since I joined Covenant EFC as a member, I thank God for how He has graciously touched my life and family. Ten years ago, I was working as a director in an education institution, and concurrently holding four directorial appointments. Spending 16 hours daily at the workplace was common for me. I was an absentee husband and father, and sadly blind to it.

Then my wife wisely suggested that I take a break to join the Men's Breakthrough Weekend retreat with new Covenant Group (CG) friends. I went despite some initial hesitation. I can still recall that at the retreat, I felt convicted in my spirit to make a decisive action to have dinner with my family at least three times a week. Coming home for dinner on a weekday may not mean much for many families, but for mine, that's a huge change! Little did I know that the Breakthrough Weekend precipitated a journey of “remove and replace” in me. When God breaks in, and we break with, we experience breakthroughs! Through many more Breakthrough Weekends I attended, God did more “removing” work in my life.

Removal and replacement went hand-in-hand. I soon started to replace my old ways with a new-found rhythm of life gained through several Covenant EFC discipleship platforms such as

personal devotion, CG, Intentional Discipleship Training (IDT) and serving in the men's ministry as a lay person. I was not trying to cram more activities into my life. Rather, as I grew spiritually, broke from workaholic tendencies, and struck a balance in personal growth, family, work and service, I found myself refocused, rested and having meaningful results.

Today, by God's grace, He has taken me a little further along in the journey of “remove and replace”. And as I continue my journey, I have found a list of 10 obstacles to be removed (described in Rev Edmund Chan's book *Growing Deep in God*, pp. 101–107) to be most helpful for regular self-examination. These obstacles include:

- Unyielded life
- Unsound theology
- Unconfessed sins
- Untutored spirit
- Uncrossed bridges
- Unfounded fears
- Undefined priorities
- Unresolved guilt
- Unwholesome relationships
- Unrighteous motives

Jesus has promised us an abundant life as we follow Him, abide in Him and live a Spirit-empowered life. We are called to put off our old ways. We must also make every effort to put on the things that make for godliness and rest in the Lord (Eph 4:22–24).

Unlikely Lives in Remarkable Service of God's Mission

Scripture: **ACTS 8:26-40** // Sermon: **DR CRAIG OTT**

Introduction

We all know the names of great saints such as Augustine, Martin Luther, and D.L. Moody, but we don't know the names of the people who influenced their lives. Unknown does not mean unimportant! You may feel unworthy or unable to serve God. But God desires to touch and use even the most unlikely people, broken people, marginalised people to advance His purposes in remarkable ways (1 Cor 12:22-24).

Four Features of the Ethiopian Eunuch Important to Our Question of How God Can Use the Marginalised and Broken:

1. He is nameless.
2. He is an African.
3. He is a Jew or God-fearer.
4. He is a eunuch – eunuchs were excluded from the Old Testament assembly of the people of God (Deut 23:1). They were among the most ridiculed and marginalised people in the ancient world.

Two Remarkable Demonstrations of God's Grace in the Life of the Ethiopian Eunuch:

1. He demonstrates that God accepts the marginalised and wounded. This is a fulfillment of Isaiah 56:3-8, that tells how God will receive those who were rejected and marginalised as His people. No matter who you are, God's grace in Jesus Christ reaches out to accept you (Mt 11:28, Jn 6:37).
2. He demonstrates how God can wonderfully use the marginalised and wounded. The eunuch becomes the first missionary to Africa, indeed perhaps the very first missionary to the Gentiles in the Early Church! God's grace not only accepts, but also employs in His service in remarkable ways.

Five Ways How the Ethiopian Eunuch Moved from the Place of Marginality to This Place of Significant Service:

1. He was committed to worship God, in spite of his limitations – he would have been rejected when he traveled to Jerusalem to worship.
2. He was a student of the Word of God, in spite of his lack of understanding – he was reading the scroll of Isaiah as he traveled home.
3. He was teachable by a man of God, in spite of his high position – he received the teaching of Philip.
4. He received the grace of God and became a follower of Jesus – he was baptised.
5. He was willing to become a messenger of God – he returned to his homeland as God's missionary telling others of the grace of God in Christ.

Conclusion

No matter how broken, marginalised or unworthy you may feel, don't underestimate how God might desire to use you as an agent of His mission in the world. Just follow the five ways of the Ethiopian eunuch to discover how God might use you in His mission to the world.
