Let's Honour and Hear Our Mothers

Why do we celebrate Mother's Day?

The intent to set a day to commemorate Mother's Day is a good idea, but it has turned into a giant money-making machine for businesses. It has become so commercialised that I wonder if we are celebrating it just because everyone else does. I have heard of extended families coming together to eat in restaurants without much deep interaction with one another, and left the place poorer in cash. For others, they continue their family fights and leave their mothers more broken-hearted.

Perhaps we need to revisit why we want to celebrate Mother's Day. I can think of two reasons:

To honour them with our presence.

Exodus 20:12 tells us, "Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you." It is a commandment from God and meant to be obeyed.

Being very busy, we often forget to spend time to be with our mothers who have made much sacrifice to raise us. This day is set aside for us as a reminder to make time

for them, to serve them and appreciate them for the love and time they invested in our lives.

To hear them share their stories.

How many of us really know the journeys of our mothers — what they went through, the challenges they faced and the joy they had in parenting us? From their stories, we can glean wisdom for our own journeys and learn to avoid pitfalls that come along our way.

I remember this account from my late Mom: She would get so upset with me when I couldn't stop crying because of certain difficulties. However, she realised that her scolding would make me cry more, so she learned to sit with me and hold my hand. After a while, my crying would stop. Today, I am doing the same to my daughter: sit with her, listen to her and hold her hand whenever she is in tears. It not only helps her to stop crying, it also binds our hearts together.

You know what, to honour our mothers with our presence and to hear them share their stories need not take place only on Mother's Day. It can happen everyday and any day.

Rise Up!

SCRIPTURE: HAGGAI 1:12–15 ■ SERMON: REV TAN KAY KIONG

Introduction

Obedience: “The bottom line in the Christian life is obedience and most people don’t even like the word.” (Charles Stanley). See 1 Samuel 15:22 and John 14:21. The people needed to wake up and return to their mission.

Two ingredients to rise up in obedience:

A. Fearing God

“And the people **feared** the LORD.” (v.12)

We can miss the prime motivation for the people’s obedience. Tucked in the end of verse 12 are these words: “And the people feared the LORD.” But what caused this 180 degree turn? They were living in defiance, self absorption and total desperation in the face of the drought. But they obeyed God quickly because they had the fear of God.

Tozer: “When men no longer fear God, they transgressed his laws without hesitation. The fear of consequences is no deterrent when the fear of God is gone.”

Luther: Distinguish between **servile** fear and **filial** fear. One is an unhealthy fear of God as a prisoner fears the tormentor. The other is a healthy fear of God as a child respecting and loving the parents.

Proverbs: The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom. Not some formulae steps to a life of wisdom but a relationship of love and trust that causes us to fear Him.

See examples of the fear of God: Genesis 22:12, Exodus 20:20, Luke 12:4-5, Revelation 15:4-5

B. Doing God's Will

“And they came and worked on the house of God.” (v.15)

1. From the time they heard the word of God (Hag 1:1) to the time they acted on it (Hag 1:15) was 24 days. Considering how they didn’t obey God for 15 years and it took them 24 days to start working again is a revival.
2. Notice the factors leading to their doing of God’s will in verses 14 to 15
 - a. Who is doing God’s will: Everyone — governor, leader and all the remnants
 - b. How they are doing God’s will: God stirred up their “spirit” (three times)— from inside out.
 - c. What motivated them to do God’s will: “I am with you.” (v.13)

Conclusion

Now that’s obedience!
