hear an increasing concern from church leaders and parents about losing our youths. I agree that today's children and youths are more exposed to sin than any other generation. However, I can also say this — I have never seen a more spiritually sensitive and compassionate generation than the one I am witnessing right now. God is bringing about a dynamic transformation!

Three weeks ago, we held a camp for the WEB youths (11 to 14-year-olds). At the second half of the camp, their parents joined us. During two response times, we saw parents embracing their children in prayer, and the children reciprocating, hugging and blessing their parents. Some parents testified that their children have not hugged them for many years until this camp! It reminded me of Malachi 4:6a "And he will turn the hearts of fathers to their

children and the hearts of children to their fathers "This is a generation that can make a tremendous difference! Nothing is impossible for our enormous God! The evil one will do everything possible to drive the next generation away from Jesus. But as a Church, we must arise and let the devil know we come in the name of Jesus! This is the time for us to pray and disciple!

Yesterday was the beginning of 40 Days for Our Nation prayer season and today is TNG (The Next Generation) Sunday. This is the best time to pray for Christian families to be disciples who reach out to other families. This is also the most opportune time to pray for Christian children and youths to be discipled and to be history-makers — bringing godly transformation to their generation, to Singapore and beyond.

Pray! Invest and disciple! Believe!

Confidence Despite Challenges

SCRIPTURE: EZRA 5:3-I7 ■ SERMON: SANDRA CHI

Introduction

There are always challenges in a building project. Following on from the experience of opposition in Ezra 4 and the repentance they displayed in Haggai, the returnees have restarted building. In starting over, they experience challenges yet again in the form of an official investigation by the authorities.

Two reasons why we can have confidence despite challenges:

A. Our God Watches Over Us (vv.3-5)

"But the eye of their God was on the elders of the Jews, ..." (v.5)

There was a legitimate investigation into the rebuilding due to the changes in political power and the frequency of rebellions in the Persian Empire in the first two years of King Darius' reign.

However, the intimidation is more subtle since it requested for the names of the leaders (v.4). There is risk of the individual leaders getting into trouble. Yet the response of the returnees was to continue building despite the intimidation.

The reason for their confidence was their faith that God was watching over them (v.5).

Application: Many of us find it difficult to believe that God is watching over us especially when faced with a long period of waiting or experiencing a series of challenges.

Illustration: God challenged my idea of His love and His concern due to high risk of Down's syndrome with my first child.

In our waiting, God is watching over us.

B. Our God Is the Sovereign Lord (vv.6–17)

"We are the servants of the God of heaven and earth, ..." (v.11)

Their reply to King Darius was a very honest look at their national history. In their repentance at the preaching of Haggai, the returnees had an honest reckoning that it was their sin that led them to this state. Yet, they could acknowledge the sovereignty of God in their history despite their sin and the mess they were in (v.11).

Application: The world order is a mess. We need to acknowledge that God is still sovereign despite our mess. Our role is to come before Him in holy desperation. Yet with God, there is always a "divine however" (v.13). In His sovereignty, God can still turn around impossible situations.

Illustration: Story of a young person struggling to change and experienced the transformative power of the Holy Spirit.

In our mess, God is sovereign over us.

Conclusion

Rise up in faith to believe that God is watching over us and is sovereign over us.
