Responding to 377A

The past couple of weeks has seen much debate over the 377A. It is not possible to fully address the many nuances to this delicate matter here. Rather, this is for Covenanters to hear our heart as to why, on this particular occasion, we have given a stronger call to respond in voicing our concerns as citizens. Firstly, although we did not know the scope of review, there was awareness that a major review of the Penal Code was ongoing. Secondly, we had three prominent members of society who made their personal views about repealing this law publicly known. Lastly, the Law minister stating that, on this matter, society would have to decide. It is rare for Covenant EFC to do so, but with the confluence of such signals in the public sphere, we felt led to lead you to respond lest our silence be misread as assent. As part of society, we have a responsibility to voice our concerns and we should do so clearly but respectfully and with God's love.

We understand that some of us feel conflicted. Firstly, you recognise that the law in itself criminalizes private acts and as the government has mentioned, will not be enforced. We agree. Archbishop William of the Catholic Church in Singapore puts it well: *"Indeed, I would not object to a repeal of S377A if it were merely aimed at removing all potential criminal penalties against homosexuals. However, until and unless Parliament puts in place a formulation that more perfectly encapsulates the spirit of the law, guaranteeing the protection of the rights of the majority who favour*

the traditional family, and that no further demands be made to legalise same-sex unions, adoption of babies by same sex couples, surrogacy, or to criminalise those who do not support the homosexual lifestyle, I am of the view that S377A should not be repealed under the present circumstances..." (emphasis ours)

We believe God has called the Church towards the flourishing of human culture and society as best as we can while we await our eternal home. And we believe that this flourishing best happens in a society where covenantal marriage is between a man and a woman. Secondly, we understand that there may be differences in perspectives as how to approach this issue. Therefore, how should you respond as a member of Covenant if you feel differently from how your leaders are leading you? As we have done in the past, we encourage everyone to seek the Lord and to respond as best as our conscience directs us before the LORD because we are all ultimately accountable to God for our decisions. We are thankful for how Covenanters have always engaged in constructive dialogue with leaders even when opinion differs. Through this, we are not saying we are better than anyone else. Indeed we acknowledge that Covenant EFC is not what she should be and as leaders, we have often led you in repentance first over *our own* sin and failures. That has been our consistent posture. This thus again highlights our own need for repentance – foremost for our own inadequacies and moral failures and to ask God to change us, mature us. We, in Covenant EFC, need true revival! Let us pray and live in that direction.

THE SURPRISES OF GOD

SCRIPTURE: ACTS 15:36-16:10 • SERMON: REV EDMUND CHAN

Introduction

1. I often help Ann up and down the stairs because of her eyesight's lack of depth perception.
2. Depth perception. In biblical narratives, we must see the theological canvas that reveals God to us!
3. God of Surprises! Five Surprises -

Surprise 1. The Surprise of God's CONCESSION

Acts 15:39 "And there arose a sharp disagreement, so that they separated from each other..."

1. Paul and Barnabas had a "sharp disagreement" over an HR matter!
2. We often wish for a God to solve our problems, including our disagreements. But God often allows disagreements to shape us!
3. Illustr. Ps KK's first Elders' Meeting. Disagreement is not always bad (provided we don't take it personally!)

Surprise 2. The Surprise of God's CHOICE

Acts 16:1 "...Timothy, the son of a Jewish woman who was a believer, but his father was a Greek."

1. God is often not politically correct!
2. Don't underestimate the choice of God.
3. Illustr. God's choice of the head of a Christian organisation.

Surprise 3. The Surprise of God's COMMITMENT

Acts 16:5 "So the churches were strengthened in the faith, and they increased in numbers daily."

1. We often think God rewards by merit but His is a commitment of Grace!
2. Illustr. Story of Dunkirk!
3. God answers prayer to bless us!

Surprise 4. The Surprise of God's CONSTRAINTS

Acts 16:6-7 "... having been forbidden by the Holy Spirit to speak the word in Asia ... they attempted to go into Bithynia, but the Spirit of Jesus did not allow them."

1. God knows what He's doing!
2. Illustr. Rejecting an offer to study theology overseas just because God said NO - it was a blessing to obey God!
3. God is BIG enough, GOOD enough and WISE enough!

Surprise 5. The Surprise of God's CALLING

Acts 16:9-10. "And when Paul had seen the vision, immediately we sought to go on into Macedonia, concluding that God had called us ..."

1. God often initiates without Committee and Consensus! He calls leaders to lead.
2. When God calls you – don't fear!

Conclusion.
